Weekly Review—January 31, 2025

A gentle rain washed away the remnants of January's snow which beautifully covered the ugliness of November's fallen leaves not unlike the façade hiding the evil that lurked under the surface of the man passing by unnoticed in yesterday's traffic (mmmrrrppp – record scratch!) Sorry folks! I've been spending too much time reading thrillers, I guess. Ahem. This week's economic releases and the FOMC meeting left us hanging on the edge of our seat, waiting to glimpse any signs of actionable intelligence. But we were called back from our mission due to lack of target confirmation.

The first release of GDP for the fourth quarter of 2024 was a 2.3% change from 3Q, down in pace but within normal ranges for the US productivity measure. Personal consumption and Personal Spending of 4.2% and 0.7%, respectively, were positive but did not send any exciting ripples through the bond market. Interest rates held relatively steady – even after an FOMC meeting! The Committee voted for no action and while this was mostly expected, the message being sent for future action to lower rates remains like a leaf floating gently down a stream, not worrying about any potential obstacles as the leaf has been here before (Whoa! Sorry again for that mediocre attempt of producing a literary *tour de force*). Back to it. We remain in a waiting period. Will the proposed tariffs decimate financial markets like some of the headlines convey? Or are they mere negotiating tactics to begin talking about other policy objectives? At time of writing, the original deadline of tomorrow to impose 25% tariffs on Canada and Mexico appears to be delayed. "Take us to DefCon 4." Crisis averted...for now. **The White House confirmed the tariffs are still set to be applied as of tomorrow in a press conference around 12:30pm.** And so it begins.

Next week, we receive labor data which may provide more actionable intelligence. Expectations are for around 150,000 jobs added with the Unemployment rate to remain at 4.1%. Tune in next week to see how our heroes in the Capital Markets Group jump into action to once again save the world!
