## Weekly Review—August 22, 2025

As explained in my last weekly write-up, the Fed is in a conundrum in terms of achieving their Congressional dual mandate of administering monetary policy to foster maximum employment and stable prices. Evidenced in recent economic data, annualized economic growth for the first half of this year slowed significantly and is not expected to pick back up - based on the most recent Bloomberg survey of top Economists. Job growth has lost momentum as the recent three-month average job gains (of 35k) fell significantly below last year's 166k monthly average. The unemployment rate continues trending upward. So much for maximum employment! On the inflation front, prices remain above-target and are trending upward, not downward. The Fed appears to have lost the upper hand in terms of regaining price stability. That said, the economy continues its flirtatious relationship with stagflation – an economic nightmare characterized by rising unemployment, elevated/high inflation and stagnant economic growth.

This week's market focus centered on how Fed policy makers plan to address current economic conditions. Speaking at the Fed's annual Jackson Hole symposium, Fed Chairman Powell stated, "with policy in restrictive territory, the baseline outlook and the shifting balance of risks may warrant adjusting our policy stance." While many market participants see this as the Fed's way of opening the door for a possible rate cut as early as next month, I'm not convinced! His comments are simply stating the obvious as policy makers remain mostly data dependent. Even though July's employment report showed signs of material weakness, Powell's comments on labor market conditions fell short of signaling the need for an immediate policy response. If August's employment data misses to the upside, policy makers will likely hold rates steady at their September policy meeting. If August's employment data shows continued labor market stress, expect a cut. For those keeping score, the Fed has left benchmark rates unchanged at a range of 4.25% to 4.50% at all five of this year's policy meetings.
